Volunteer registration deadline is **4:00 PM on Friday, Sept. 14th!**
- Pick your shift. Volunteer for the entire event or the morning only.

On the Day of the Event...

- Wear sturdy closed toe footwear (no sandals), old clothes, and jeans/rugged pants (no shorts).
- Bring appropriate gear (coat, hat, sunglasses, rain jacket).
A few volunteers will be stationed outdoors.
- Follow the event signs (from the the corner of Hudson Road and Technology Parkway) to the volunteer parking area.
Check in by 7:45 AM.
- You will need to sign a waiver, then pick up your safety vest, eye protection, and gloves. Safety training will follow.
- Donuts, lunch, and beverages will be provided.



Old TVs and computer monitors with Cathode Ray Tubes (CRTs) each contain 6-8 pounds of toxic lead. This recycling event keeps e-waste & home chemicals out of the Black Hawk County Landfill!
