- Volunteers must be at least 18 years old.
- Call or email the Waste Trac Education Team to register.
Volunteer registration deadline is **4:00 PM on Friday, April 6th!**
- Pick your shift. Volunteer for the entire event or the morning only.
- Want to lift tv's, monitors, etc. (or prefer a lighter task)?

- Have something on the list? Bring it along when you volunteer!

On the Day of the Event...

- Wear sturdy closed toe footwear (no sandals), old clothes, and jeans/rugged pants (no shorts).
- Bring appropriate gear (coat, hat, sunglasses, rain jacket).
A few volunteers will be stationed outdoors.
- Follow the event signs (from the corner of Hwy 218 and Mitchell Avenue) to the volunteer parking area at the back of the Waste Water Treatment Plant. **Check in by 7:45 AM.**
- You will need to sign a waiver, then pick up your safety vest, goggles, and gloves. Safety training will follow.
- Donuts, lunch, and beverages will be provided.



Old TVs and computer monitors with Cathode Ray Tubes (CRTs) each contain 6-8 pounds of toxic lead. This recycling event keeps e-waste & home chemicals out of the Black Hawk County Landfill!
